- Established in 1981 under a Joint Powers Agreement between Amador and Tuolumne BOS
  - Tri-partite Board of 18 members
- Almost exclusively supporting low-income and vulnerable populations in Amador, Calaveras, and Tuolumne since 1981
- Primary Departments include; Early Childhood Services, Housing, Energy, Youth Services, Community Services, Food Bank and Administrative Services
- Annual Revenue is between \$11M and \$12M with 125 - 135 staff members
- Supporting Services in 27 rural counties

- ATCAA has provided Energy related services to Calaveras County since 1982
  - Prop-1 Water Conservation – South of Hwy-4 in the T-Stan watershed
  - LIHEAP Utility Assistance and Weatherization
  - SWEATS & EHCS Emergency Services
  - DOE WAP & BIL DOE Weatherization: Intensive in-home air quality inspection and remediation.

## LIHEAP

- The Low-Income Heating and Energy Assistance Program provides utility assistance payments for qualifying residents in the form of a direct payment to electricity or propane provider
- Payments range from \$357-\$1500
- Approximately 1160 households in the tri-county area are served each year
- Eligible clients can receive weatherization services once every 5 years.
- Services include safety testing, energy saving appliances, health and safety measures, leak reduction, heating and cooling repair.
- Severe Weather Energy Assistance and Transportation Services (SWEATS)
- Emergency Heating and Cooling Services (EHCS)

## DOE WAP IJA

- The Department of Energy Weatherization Assistance Program Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act provides intensive in-home air quality inspection and remediation
- Priority path or audit path
- Eligible clients can receive weatherization services up to every 10 years.
- Services include safety testing, energy saving appliances, health and safety measures, leak reduction, heating and cooling repair, air quality improvements

- Leak Repair
- Low-flow Toilets
- Replace Washing Machines and Dishwashers
- Hose Timers and Drip Systems
- Winterize Spigots and Pipes
- Other Measures as Feasible

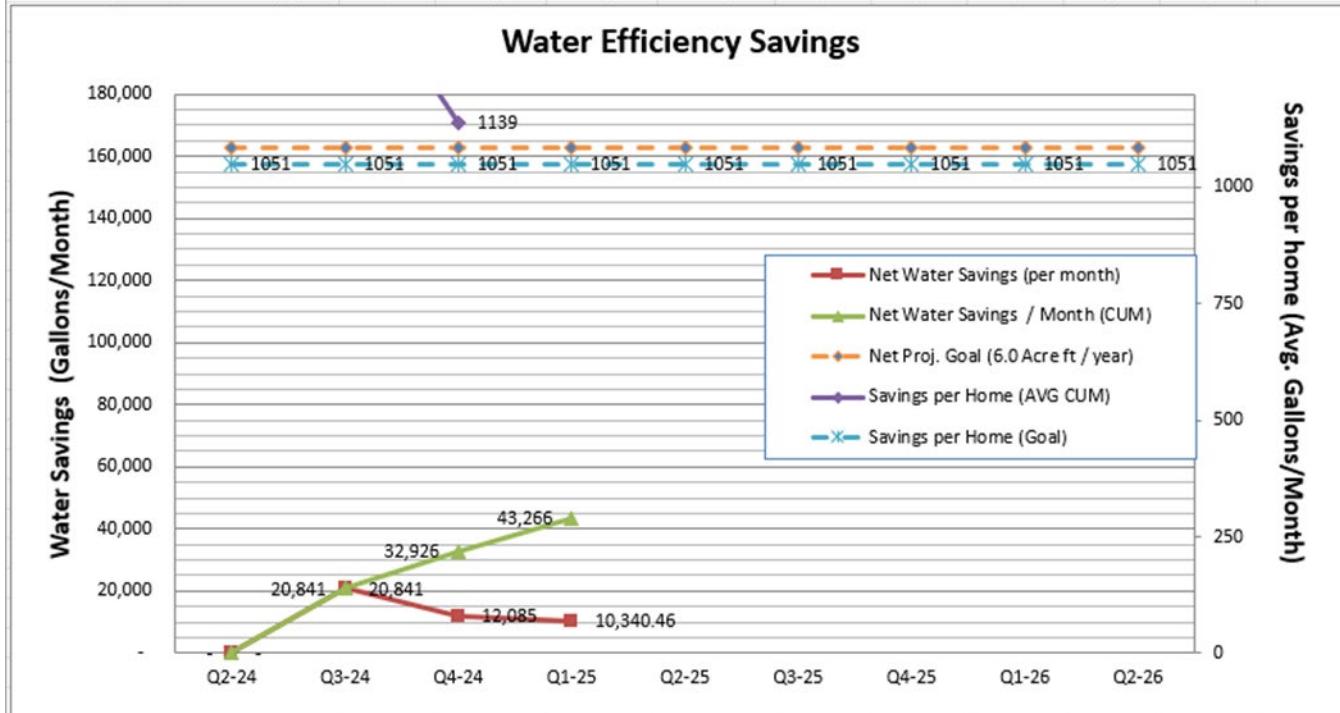

## Low Income Water Assistance Program (LIWAP)

- In response to the COVID-19 Pandemic
- Ran from April 2022-April 2024
- Provided \$340,244.00 in services to residents of Amador, Calaveras and Tuolumne Counties
- 547 Households received support
- Households received an average payment of \$617.00
- No additional funding available

*Currently there is no known water assistance funding*
